Treasurers Report:

Beginning balance 10,713.09 After deposits from Kip Larson Clinic and -New Memberships received, \$11,833.09 Kristi motioned to accept the current report, Donna seconded.

Our NCCC membership dues are due, which is a total of \$250. Leslie made motion that we pay the NCCC membership dues and Kristi seconded.

Heather and Kristi will fill out the paperwork for our insurance renewal.

Old Business:

The Kip Larson clinic was a success and brought in a total of \$512.45 Heather made a motion and Leslie 2nd, to refund Jess Dunn \$20 for a spectator fee as she paid \$40 for the weekend and the fee was only \$20. This was not caught at the clinic.

All forms have been submitted to APHA for our May show. We will be sending out info for our shows to everyone on the email list, also posting on facebook and our website. It was mentioned that when we send things out on email to BCC people to cut down on the spam from others. Shannon Tomes or Donna Hover will be working on postcards to mail out as a save the date.

New Business:

Our May show will be listed as the Farnam Fun in the Sun Specialty show as they will be donating all of our exhibitor awards!

We will need to make sure exhibitors use the correct class list that is on our website, rather than the one SJPHC sent out with their entry. Jennifer Mendes has the corrected, final one. Also need to make people aware that all RV's & bedding must be reserved through Murieta Equine Center. We will be posting all of our patterns online by May 1st so that our exhibitors

can prepare! Heather made a motion and Leslie 2nd that we make our patterns available ahead of time.

We still need trail scribes, ring steward and a gate person for Rancho. Great way to get your work hours in! You can also have someone work for you while you're showing!

Yreka Show: We will be working on the paperwork and Yreka entry to submit to APHA for the Regional Club Sponsorship. That is due by April 15th. Leslie, Kristi, Jennifer and Angie will be finalizing the class list, fee structure etc. We also came up with ideas of why our club deserves the Regional Club Sponsorship. Below is a description of how the program is designed.

The American Paint Horse Association has created a new way to reward their network of Regional Clubs for their efforts to encourage participation, recruit new members, offer creative show formats and enhance the exhibitor's experiences at their Regional Club-sponsored APHA shows. Regional Clubs are the backbone of the APHA experience; as such, the Regional Club Sponsorship Program supports those clubs that go the extra mile to make their APHA shows a great experience.

Regional Clubs provide the framework for attracting new members at the local or "grassroots" level and are just as their name suggests—a local group of Paint Horse enthusiasts that work together to hold events and gain support for Paints in their area. Since its inception in 1962, the Association has approved more than 115 Regional Clubs worldwide, which in turn are required to offer horse shows, trail rides and assorted community events within their respective areas in order to maintain their status.

The Regional Club Sponsorship Program will offer \$1,000 cash awards to 30 clubs annually for use at a Regional Club-sponsored Paint-O-Rama show; or at a 1- or 2-judge show that the club is hosting in 2012. Clubs will be eligible for the sponsorship once during a two-year period and must be in good standing with APHA as outlined by Association rules. The club must fulfill all annual Regional Club requirements and the show must be approved with all show fees paid. The complete list of program rules and sponsorship application are available online at apha.com/showing or by calling APHA.

We decided to add the Color Class for Overo & Tobiano at the Yreka show. Here are the requirements for the Color class:

A. Class open to all Regular Registry horses, one year and older, all sexes. Points in this class will be applied toward an ROM, Superior, Honor Roll and Top 20 awards and Breeders' Trust payouts. Points in this class will not count toward an APHA Championship or any other APHA awards.

B. Color class may be offered Combined, All Ages, All Sexes or split by pattern, Overo and Tobiano. If classes are offered split, Tobiano-Overo horses must choose the class the horse's markings are most like.

C. The purpose of this class is to reward the most ideal markings of the individual Paint Horse as defined as a 50/50 distribution of white and color overall.

D. The Tobiano pattern to be judged 100% on the most ideal markings of the individual Tobiano Paint and Overo pattern to be judged 100% on the most ideal markings of the individual Overo Paint.

E. Conformation is not considered and the class should not be conducted like a conformation halter class.

F. Horses to be shown in a halter, regular or show type is acceptable.

We had two memberships come in that were mailed to the previous treasurer, with the 2011 form and the old membership dues. One of them sent a note with hers saying if the dues had increased she would pay the difference. The other did not know about the new fees and does not have any access to the website or email. Because it was the club's fault for having the old form available on our website, with the old fees, we feel that we should accept the membership as received. Jennifer made a motion and Donna 2nd.

SJPHC is willing to use one of our two shows to count towards their yearend awards if we approve their shows. We made the decision to let the member's best show out of SJPHC's two shows count towards our year end awards as well. Points system will be based off of what Jennifer Mendes uses. Leslie made the motion that we use the best out of two shows and Angie 2nd.
